The Art of Hope Street

In collaboration with an array of community partners and volunteers, Hope Street Margolis Family Center offers creative arts programming to support the healthy development of its children and youth. Thanks to dedicated and talented instructors, and generous donor support, visual and performing arts classes encourage children to expand their world view and express themselves creatively.

Ask any Hope Street student who's tried to create a self-portrait using pencils and brushes attached to a long stick and they'll tell you, "It's hard!" In a recent art project, Hope Street Students experienced what it's like to be physically challenged when they had to hold a stick at the very top while sitting in a chair with art paper taped to the floor. The resulting artwork depicted the challenges they faced.

Dance classes, including ballet, contemporary and hip-hop, are offered twice per week through partnerships with Invertigo Dance Theatre and Angelica Center for the Arts, which also teaches theatre to Hope Street Kids. Every week Thiago Winterstein, who comes to us from The Young Musicians Foundation, teaches music to Hope Street students. On Tuesday, October 24th, eight Anne Banning Auxiliary volunteers from Operation School Bell (OSB) came to Hope Street to measure clothing and shoe sizes for over 200 children. Operation School Bell, a program of the Assistance League of Los Angeles, provides underserved elementary school children in LA Unified School District (LAUSD) with new school clothes, enhancing their self-esteem and their readiness to learn. After taking measurements, volunteers returned to OSB’s headquarters to sort and pack shirts, jumpers, pants, shorts, shoes and hygiene kits into new backpacks, which were distributed to Hope Street on November 20th.
