Hope Street Margolis Family Center (Hope Street) was established in 1992 as a collaboration between the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) and Dignity Health-California Hospital Medical Center (CHMC).

Today, Hope Street continues its proven track record of empowering and strengthening families by addressing the social determinants of health through a continuum of care including early childhood education, child welfare, behavioral health, parent education, health, youth and social services that support the entire family from birth to adulthood.

As a program of CHMC, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit hospital, Hope Street relies on the generosity of the community and

THE NEST

The Nest is Hope Street's fourth and newest early childhood center that opened in April 2022.

In March 2019, California Hospital Medical Center was awarded Early Head Start expansion funding from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Administration for Children and Families to provide center-based services for 32 toddlers and young children and home-based services for nine pregnant women, infants and toddlers.

In 2019, Hope Street partnered with architectural firm Perkins&Will, who designed the center pro bono through its Social Purpose program.

The Nest joins Angelica Lutheran Church, Mercy Housing California and Hope Street Margolis Family Center as licensed early care and education centers that help fill the community's urgent need for high-quality childcare and school readiness services. These centers provide full-day, year-round early care and education for 192 infants, toddlers and preschool-aged children, within fully inclusive settings. Services are designed to meet the specific needs of low-income parents employed in the nearby garment and light manufacturing district.

Why "The Nest"?

The center's innovative and inspirational design is based on the concept of a "nest"—with classrooms serving as places of refuge, safety and comfort as well as places where children can explore, take risks and spread their wings.
